

DOGS CAN'T SMELL DRUGS... BECAUSE DRUGS DONT SMELL!

The question at hand is whether the police can bring a dog to your door to smell for Cannabis. (Or anything else for that matter). Rather, it is the collateral chemical compounds associated with drugs that smell. In the case of Cannabis it is a class of chemicals called Terpenes that are common to all Conifers, Citrus, other fruits, and many spices. In the case of synthetics, it is chemicals like acids, solvents, and ammonia that smell. All these chemicals are legal and commonly available.
